

## **HOSPICE SERVICE UPDATE**

As a physician referring patients for hospice, it's essential you know about a new Medicare requirement. On January 1, 2011, CMS will require mandated face-to-face physician visits that affect hospice agencies across the United States.

## What:

- Any patient on hospice 180 days and beyond will be required to have a face-to-face visit by the hospice medical director prior to recertification to determine appropriateness for continued hospice eligibility.
   A patient must comply with this mandate, or services cannot continue and the patient will be discharged from service.
- If a patient is discharged from one hospice and wishes to be re-admitted to another, a face-to-face physician visit will be required in order to determine eligibility by the admitting hospice.
- The patient's PCP cannot perform this visit. It is to be provided as a service by the employed hospice physician or nurse practitioner of the Medicare-certified hospice.

## Why:

• To determine appropriateness for continued hospice eligibility and prevention of governmental fraud.

## How this affects you:

- Patients who have been on hospice longer than six months, or discharged due to stability, must have a
  face-to-face visit by the hospice medical director *before* readmission to hospice or recertification for
  hospice to continue.
- Determination of patient eligibility could be delayed due to face-to-face mandates and government office hours, which are closed on weekends and holidays.
- Hospitalized patients wishing to be admitted to hospice upon discharge could experience delays due to the new requirements.
